The use of pediatric endoscopic skull base surgery has continued to grow as techniques and technology pioneered in the adult population have been applied to children.

Surgery routinely involves a laminectomy or decompression, which is sometimes associated with fusion. In our case, we adopted the posterior percutaneous endoscopic technique, and, to the best of our knowledge, our work is the first such report.

Open surgery, usually in the form of laminectomy, seems to be the main course of treatment, particularly in patients with neurological deficits. Percutaneous endoscopic technique is routinely performed for disc herniation and spinal canal stenosis at our department.

Endoscopic sinus surgery usually takes between one and three hours and is done in the operating room with the child under general anesthesia. Most young children spend the night in the hospital but some older children may stay for only a couple of hours after surgery.
